Reducing Risk of Automobile Accidents & Guidelines for Using Your Car on the Job

- 1) Know your route use GPS if you are not sure where you are going.
- 2) Use your headlights at dawn and dusk.
- 3) Go the speed limit.
- 4) Wear your seatbelt. When transporting clients, they must also wear their seatbelt.
- 5) Keep your car clean so it is a comfortable ride for your client.

6) Know the guidelines on where your client is allowed to go for transportation assistance. Any questions should be directed to your Care Manager.

7) Caregivers are not allowed to drive anyone other than the client. (No friends or family members.)

8) Make sure your car is properly maintained. (Change the oil, replace balding tires, etc.)

9) Check your mirrors and blind spot frequently.

10) If you were to get in an accident or experience mechanical failure while on the road, reach out to a live person at the office right away.
